

Worm Egg Count Request Form – please complete your details below

We recommend routine faecal worm egg counts every 2 - 3 months (March-November); another one may be required in January/February if your horse(s) is grazing over winter.

The faecal egg count results should be used in conjunction with the risk assessment to determine if the horse(s) need to be wormed. We also recommend testing for tapeworm (saliva or blood test) in Sep/Oct. The ideal time to do annual worm risk assessments is Oct/Nov – this can be used to decide if autumn worming for encysted redworm is required. Low risk horses may not need worming (eg with moxidectin) in the Autumn/Winter for encysted redworm.
